Please note that as an accredited organization, you are required to file a report of your activities to UN Environment every four years from the date of accreditation. This report known as quadrennial report is to be submitted to the Secretariat of Governing Bodies and Stakeholders in a specific format that UN Environment will communicate to you.

## THE RULES OF PROCEDURE

## XIII. OBSERVERS OF INTERNATIONAL NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS

## **Rule 70**

- 1. International non-governmental organizations having an interest in the field of the environment referred to in section IV, paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 2997 (XXVII), may designate representatives to sit as observers at public meetings of the United Nations Environment Assembly and it subsidiary organs, if any. The United Nations Environment Assembly shall from time to time adopt and revise when necessary a list of such organizations. Upon the invitation of the President or Chairperson, as the case may be, and subject to the approval of the United Nations Environment Assembly or of the subsidiary organ concerned, international non-governmental organizations may make oral statements on matters within the scope of their activities.
- 2. Written statements provided by international non-governmental organizations referred to in paragraph 1 above, related to items on agenda of the United Nations Environment Assembly or of its subsidiary organs shall be circulated by the secretariat to members of the United Nations Environment Assembly or of the subsidiary organ concerned in the quantities and in the languages in which statements were made available to the secretariat for distribution.
